

ADVISORY ON COVID-19

INBOUND PASSENGERS TO SELETAR AIRPORT

Passengers with recent travel history in the last 14 days to the following areas are to note the following border control measures from the Singapore Ministry of Health (MOH):

Travel History in the last 14-days in Countries/Regions	For Singapore Residents and Long-Term Pass Holders	For Short-Term Visitors
Hubei province (mainland China)	14-day quarantine	No entry or transit through Singapore for all Short-Term Visitors, with limited entry for Work-Pass Holders
[From 23 March 2020, 2359 hours]	14-day Stay-Home Notice (SHN)	
All other countries and regions		<i>Singapore's Ministry of Manpower will only allow the entry/return of Work-Pass Holders, including their dependents, for those providing essential services, such as in healthcare or transport.</i>

Passengers on all arrival flights at Seletar Airport are subject to temperature screening.

All travellers entering Singapore and exhibiting fever and/or other symptoms of respiratory illness are required to undergo a COVID-19 swab test at the checkpoints, regardless of travel history. Such travellers will also be issued a 14-day SHN, which they will have to serve in full even if the result of the swab test is negative. Those who meet the clinical suspect case definition will be conveyed to the hospital for follow-up.

Travellers who are issued a 14-day SHN will have to provide proof of the place where they will serve the SHN, for example a hotel booking covering the entire period, or a place of residence they or their family members own. They may also be swabbed for testing for COVID-19, even if asymptomatic.

Nationals of China (People's Rep.) with a passport issued in Hubei Province (China People's Rep.) are not allowed to enter or transit through Singapore.

MOH points out that the Infectious Diseases Act (IDA) requires a person who has reason to suspect that he is a case or carrier of COVID-19, or a contact of a person with COVID-19, to act in a responsible manner so as to not expose other persons to the risk of infection by the disease.

BUSINESS AVIATION AIRCRAFT

The Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS) has implemented additional measures for business aviation aircraft that operate into Singapore.

All air crew (pilots and cabin crew) and passengers on business aviation aircraft are required to make a health declaration under the Infectious Diseases Act before they are permitted to depart for Singapore.

If any air crew member or passenger declares themselves to be unwell, the operator of the flight will be instructed to operate the flight as a medical evacuation (medevac) flight, and the unwell crew member or passenger will be considered a patient.

All patients arriving on medevac flights are required to be tested negative for COVID-19 at the source country before they are permitted to fly to Singapore. They would also need to have a hospital in Singapore to receive them. A risk assessment of the patient must be provided to the receiving hospital. This applies also to patients who appear to have conditions that are non-infectious.

Business aviation aircraft passengers and air crew members on non-medevac flights who exhibit fever and/or other symptoms of respiratory illness upon arrival and who are non-Singapore residents will not be allowed to enter Singapore. The aircraft will be required to turn around as soon as practicable, bearing in mind medical and flight safety. Singaporeans (SC), Permanent Residents (PR) and Long-term Pass (LTP) holders arriving on these flights will be required to go through the current arrival screening process.
